FIRST ADOPT-A-HIGHWAY LITTER PICKUP SCHEDULED




The PennDot Adopt-A-Highway program has approved the GDHS application for adoption of a two mile section of highway along Carlisle Road, stretching from the Dover Borough line to Sky Top Trail. The highway signs indicating the Greater Dover Historical Society sponsorship should be in place within the next two months.

The first litter pickup is scheduled for Saturday, October14. Participants are asked to meet at 8:00 am at Farrells' Nursery parking lot on Carlisle road just north of the borough. It is essential that volunteers register their intent to participate by Tuesday, October 10 so that the necessary supplies are available on the pickup day. In anticipation of the upcoming event, a 16 minute safety video will be shown at the August 17 society meeting.

The Adopt-A-Highway program will provide orange safety vests, gloves and trash bags. Cell phones are recommended in the event of an emergency and the need to summon help quickly.
